Check in and pay @ Pro shop, mentioning chef's tournament.





- Take the <u>Q.E.W. West.</u>
- Merge onto <u>QEW. Niagara.</u>
- Exit at <u>HWY-20/CENTENNIAL PARKWAY</u>. Turn right on HWY-20 S/CENTENNIAL PARKWAY. Continue to follow <u>HWY-20/CENTENNIAL PARKWAY</u>.
- <u>HWY-20/CENTENNIAL PARKWAY</u> turns into <u>56</u> (at stop lights - go straight).
- Turn LEFT onto <u>GOLF CLUB RD E</u>. (first left).
- Go past Hendershot Rd. and Woodburn Rd. We are on the right hand side.


From Hamilton/West:


- Take the LINCOLN M ALEXANDER PKWY E. to the end.

- <u>HWY-20/CENTENNIAL PARKWAY</u> turns into <u>HWY-56</u> (at stop lights go straight).
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
